Always (adv) - at all times; continually; on all occasions

Altitude (not attitude) (n) - the height of something above sea level

Anthem (n) - a special song officially adopted by a country as an expression of national identity (national anthem)

Aunt (not ant) (n) - sister to father or mother

Bathroom (n) - a room with a bathtub, shower, toilet, etc

Bowl (n) - deep rounded dish

Bulk (n) - large amounts of something, not in individual packages

Fax machine (n) - a machine for transmitting and receiving FAX documents

Fever (n) - a state of abnormally high body temperature

Firefighter (n) - a person whose job is to extinguish fires; fireman

Flock (n) - a group of animals (sheep, goats, birds, etc) moving together versus: herd

Handlebars (n) - the steering bar and handgrips of a bicycle or motorcycle

Coral (n) - a hard stony, rock-like deposit consisting of the skeletons of sea animals (coral)

Coral reef (n) - a very hard marine ridge or mound made of compacted coral and other material. A mound or ridge of living coral, coral skeletons, and calcium carbonate deposits from other organisms such as calcareous algae, mollusks, and protozoans. Most coral reefs form in warm, shallow sea waters and rise to or near the surface, generally in the form of a barrier reef, fringing reef, or atoll. Coral reefs grow upward from the sea floor as the polyps of new corals cement themselves to the skeletons of those below and in turn provide support for algae and other organisms whose secretions serve to bind the skeletons together. The resulting structure provides a critical habitat for a wide variety of fish and marine invertebrates. Coral reefs also protect shores against erosion by causing large waves to break and lose some of their force before reaching land. The Great Barrier Reef off the northeastern coast of Australia extends for some 2,000 km (1,240 mi), making it the world's largest coral reef.

Foreign exchange (n) - the currency of other countries

Funeral (n) - ceremony connected with the burial of the dead

Game forest (game reserve) (n) - a nature reserve national park, sanctuary, preserve, conservation area, protected area, wildlife park.

Goods (n) -merchandise; things to be transported

Grave (n) - a hole in the ground in which to bury a dead body

National Park - a reserve of natural land owned by a government, set aside for environmental protection

Necklace (n) - a sting of beads, jewels, a fine chain worn around the neck

Oasis (n) - a fertile spot in a desert where water is found

Ocean (n) - great body of salt water that covers 71% of the earth's surface

Sea (n) - large body of water, enclosed by land

Operation (n) - a process or method that is part of a series

Package (n) - something that is wrapped or boxed

Palm trees (n) - a tropical evergreen tree with large leaves at the top and branchless, patterned trunk

Port (n) - harbor where ships can load and unload cargo
